

2022 ANNUAL IMPACT REPORT

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In 2023, LCH Health and Community Services (LCH) will celebrate its 50th year of service to southern Chester County and nearby communities. LCH has evolved over the years, but our core commitment to contributing to a healthier and more connected community remains the same.

A main initiative in 2022 has been and will continue to be supporting our LCH workforce. As our staff serve our patients, we recognize that they need support too. We have invested in the wellbeing of our staff and are conducting ongoing resilience workshops throughout the year. The entire team participated in the Happiness Advantage: Orange Frog Workshops over the summer months, and we had our first all staff in person outdoor celebration in July since 2019. We conducted a community wide Walk for Wellness in the fall and we hold monthly organization wide meetings to discuss progress and to share well-being best practices.

We have recognized the need to provide care beyond our health centers and practices. We have looked for ways to meet people where they need us. Our community health screenings are free to the patient, held at off-site locations and driven by the generous support of donors. We partnered with the Philadelphia Eagles' Eye Mobile to bring vision services to pediatric patients. Additionally, LCH partnered with the Kennett Library and Chester County Hospital, to increase community health literacy about diabetes care and nutrition.

As we close out our 49th year of service we remain mindful of our past but ready for what the future brings and we are excited about 2023, our 50th year of service. We are here to serve and more committed than ever to make a difference.



Meet Rogelio, he can hear again thanks to the support of LCH Social Assistance

Rogelio Santana made an important appointment to hear again with the help of LCH! Rogelio started to lose his ability to hear in 2017. He and his family knew that he would better connect with others and provide in his day-to-day life if he could find hearing support.

Rogelio went to the LCH Social Assistance team for help. With no health insurance, Rogelio would need over \$1,400 to purchase a pair of hearing aids, an impossible amount for his young family.

LCH connected one of our many partners, the Kennett Square Lions Club, and helped Rogelio apply for hearing aid funding through the Lion James E. "Bing" Miller Charitable Foundation. Rogelio's case was accepted! Rogelio is thrilled to be able to converse with his family and they are elated and relieved he can hear the sounds around him. Now, he can perform his work safely, and he can provide for and connect further with his family and his community.

The LCH clinical team participated in a clinical study that explored the impact of integrating technology with patient care for people with diabetes with low literacy/low numeracy skills. During the study members of the LCH clinical team trained fellow staff members and patients on how to install, connect, and understand diabetes technology.

The study, which was published in Diabetes Spectrum, a peer-reviewed journal of the American Diabetes Association, showed that using LifeScan's OneTouch Verio Flex® meter with a Spanish-language version of its OneTouch Reveal® mobile application (app) led to significant and sustained improvement in diabetes management.
